TREE TRAINING (DIY)

- Structural pruning while trees are young results in healthy mature trees for future generations.
- Choose a good-quality pruning tool and plan your cuts carefully, trimming just outside the branch collar.
- Select a dominant leader to develop as the trunk and maintain lateral branches in a scaffold structure.

This day serves as a celebration for all Canadians to appreciate the great benefits that trees provide us - clean air, wildlife habitat, reducing energy demand and connecting with nature. Wyoming Tree Service offers a multimedia educational program entitled "Trees are Good" for elementary aged school children recognizing the value of trees. On the Wednesday of National Forest Week this September, celebrate National Tree Day.

PLAN TO PLANT

- As the saying goes, "The best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago. The second best time is now." Plant a tree as a memorial, as a gift or simply to enhance your landscape.
- Choose your species and location carefully, maintaining awareness of underground utilities.
- Dig a broad, shallow hole. Straighten tree in hole, filling with soil up to the trunk flare. Apply a thin layer of mulch.



WATERWORKS

- Keep the soil around your trees moist, but not water-logged. When the soil is dry below the surface of the mulch, it is time to water.
- Water trees using a sprinkler or watering bag at least once a week (barring rain) and more frequently during hot, windy weather.
- Continue until mid-fall, tapering off as lower temperatures require lessfrequent watering.
